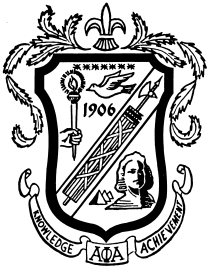

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Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., the first intercollegiate Greek letter fraternity established for black students, was organized at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, December 4, 1906. Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity was born out of the desire for maintaining close association and unified support for members of this small minority group.

With an infinite vision of an organization encompassing the ideals of scholarship, manly deeds, and love for all mankind, our seven founders, whom we respectfully call the "Jewels," aspired to bring forth a fraternity dedicated to social purpose and social action. Currently, Alpha Phi Alpha continues to grow and push for these ideals with such nationally mandated programs as "Project Alpha," "Go To High School, Go To College," "A Voteless People Is A Hopeless People," and others, which are maintained on both the undergraduate and graduate level.

The fraternity has grown steadily in influence throughout the years. It has been interracial since 1945 and has expanded tremendously to the extent that there are now approximately 800 chapters located throughout the United States, Caribbean Islands, Africa, West Indies, Europe, and Asia. Some of the more prominent sons of Alpha include the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., W.E.B. DuBois, Paul Robeson, Dick Gregory, John Hope Franklin, Thurgood Marshall, Mayor David Dinkins, Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., United States Vice President Hubert Humphrey, John H. Johnson, Duke Ellington, and Jesse Owens.

- 1) Lives within the Greater Washington DC Metropolitan area (VA, DC, MD)
- 2) Possesses a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 or better on 4.0 scale
- 3) Plans to attend a four year college or university

II. Official Transcript

Please provide an official transcript from your high school counselor or principal. Make sure it indicates the most current GPA and class ranking. Your high school counselor or principal must certify documentation in the appropriate space.

III. Recommendation Form

Please provide two recommendations. Give the attached recommendation forms to a Teacher and a School Counselor to complete.

IV. Essay Topic:

The President of the United States faces some of the most challenging and difficult questions a person can face. His answers to those questions impact people both nationally and internationally. The issues are as varied and complex as national security, global warming, world peace, world hunger, and poverty. One of the more contemporary challenges the United States President faces is how to address the growing unemployment rates for the people in his trust—the citizens of the United States. In your own words define the unemployment challenge the President faces. List at least three major elements of this issue and how those elements influence or shape the unemployment challenge itself. Explain what steps you think the President should take to address the unemployment challenge and what would be the social ramifications for taking or not taking those steps.

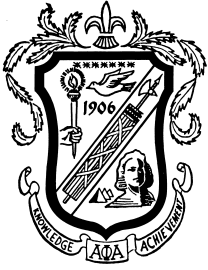
